Rotary Lakeshore Creates Major Garden at St. Catharines Hospital Site

St. Catharines May 10 2022 — The Rotary Club of St. Catharines Lakeshore has announced that it will create the **Clarice West Hobbs Contemplative Garden** at the St. Catharines site of the Niagara Health System.

Fulfilling a Local Rotarian's Dream

Clarice West-Hobbs, a long-time member of the Rotary Club of St. Catharines Lakeshore and Chair of the Club's World & Community Service Committee, had a dream of establishing a beautiful garden at the St. Catharines Hospital site, where patients and staff could enjoy a brief respite. After her untimely passing in 2020, the Club decided to support her dream by developing the Clarice West-Hobbs Contemplative Garden to be located along the entire west-facing facade of the hospital building.

With the support of the Niagara Health Foundation; building maintenance personnel from BGIS; and hospital staff and stakeholders; plans have been created to take advantage of the existing concrete walkways, benches, pergolas, lighting, flowering trees and other amenities already in place to create a full and extensive perennial garden that will fulfill Clarice's vision. Already heavily used by staff, patients and visitors alike, easily accessible from all parts of the hospital, and removed from the major parking and entry areas, this site offers the perfect opportunity for a quiet, restful garden.

“To be completed in phases, Phase 1 of the Plan includes soil upgrades, planting hardy perennials and bushes in all of the beds along the west-facing wall of the hospital and mulching during 2022.” said the Club’s Garden Chair Eric Jones, *“Future Phases already planned for later this summer and into 2023 will include installing a drip irrigation system, signage for the Garden, new benches and expanding to the other side of the walkways to the west along the existing emergency roadway.”*

The total projected budget for the Garden’s first two Phases is \$40,000

“While we are just launching our public appeal for support today, the word is out there already and the response has been incredible. The Rotary Club of St. Catharines Lakeshore has committed over \$11,000 to the project. With additional donations from individual Club members, other local Rotary Clubs, local chapters of organizations like Friendship Force Niagara and interested citizens at large,” Jones continued, *“we already have the Funds in-house for Phase 1 and are now looking to fund Phase 2.”*
